Hope to see all of you at this annual gala event at the Admiral Baker Golf Course Clubhouse on January 7th.


# Happy New Year

The lake looks something like this. The red spots mark where some of us caught fish. Many more people were fishing in the center of the lake near the channel. The Double Haul was that Saturday and the lake was crowded with early arrivals.

here has been a 3 month drought in the eastern Sierras and I think it has impacted the fishing. The low and dry streams forced people to over-fish some of the lakes. We spent many hours kicking around on our favorite lakes like Sotcher and Mary without the usual tugs, bumps and runs.

planned the monthly programs, Al Venton and Jon Hee straightened out our lease with the school district and our liability insurance and most especially, our secretary Paul Woolery kept us all organized and on track. For those of you that missed our December meeting, it was special. Lisa Sims from the Invo National Forest taught us a lot about how our mountain streams are being maintained. There were also a lot of questions from

In 2007 San Diego Fly Fishers contributed a lot of our raffle proceeds to Golden Trout Wilderness and Eastern Sierra projects. \$1,000 was donated via Cal Trout and

T.U.'s California office. \$500 went directly to Tom Loe's Lake Crowley project and \$672.89 bought fencing materials and tools to repair the cattle exclusion fences in Inyo National Forest's impacted fish habitats. We have donated an additional \$750 to support local water and fisheries conservation efforts, and \$500 to support the children's fishing program at Chollas Lake. Many of our club members have also done volunteer work on those projects. We should all be proud of contributions our Club is

making, and remember that, next summer, when it is time to participate in our Annual Raffle.

In 2008 I plan to concentrate more on our Club's conservation efforts. I hope to rejuvenate the contact list for those members interested in volunteering for conservation projects. 10 to 16 medium sized rainbows on the Upper Owens River, but everyone and their brother was fishing there and those river bends were pounded heavily every day. You did better if you did not fish behind someone. Rich Strobel did fairly well with a purple Denny Rickard's Seal Bugger one day. The next day everyone threw purple flies and they did not work as well. That is fishing.

Our cooks, Bob McKay,
Don Smith, Paul Woolery,
Bob Pharoah, Wayne
Allen and Lee McElravy
did a great job and made
up for the slower fishing.
The rest of the group
included: Bob May,
Howard Knop, Floyd Lee,
Rich Strobel, Lucky
Ketcham and our LeaderLee Anderson. We
always have a good time on this trip

Howard Knop, unfortunately caught a cold or some type of bug with chills and fever. He missed the last few days of fishing. His buddy, Floyd Lee kept him company and made sure he was okay. It is good to have friends.

and have found ways to adapt to the

cold and afternoon winds. I think it

is called Two Buck Chuck.

Lake Crowley produced the best fishing and largest fish for me and most of the group. The water level has dropped 8 feet in the past two weeks and the lake is lower than I am used to. Most of the anglers are fishing in the upper arm in the areas north of Green Banks. The guide boats are in the center of the lake near the river channel. We fished the shorelines in about 4 feet of water to catch some nice 19 inch Eagle Lake Rainbows. They fight well and jump. Most of the fish were caught on variations of the size 18 Zebra midge or Gillie. Reports on fish taken on trolled perch were fewer this year, but we did manage



a few on a light olive Punk Perch or Norb Spitzer's variation the Spitz Perch. The light olive perch worked better than the white or pearl ice version.

Wayne Allen, Paul Woolery, Lee Anderson, Don Smith, and the stream gang tried Rock Creek, Mosquito Flats, Hot Creek, and several others. The water flows at Rock Creek were okay and produced some smaller fish. The Owens River above Benton Crossing up to Jakes Hole at the third gate produced for most. (I had to resort to size 20 BWO's on 7X tippet to keep from getting skunked. Most

guides had their clients soaking midges under indicators through the deep bends and undercut banks.)

Bob Pharoah, Rich Strobel and I fished Heenan Lake for cutthroats again. The fishing is currently slow, averaging only 2 fish per angler. The ranger thinks it will turn on later in the month or in October when the trout realize the winter is coming. The fish are caught close to the weed beds on size 10 to 16 Prince Nymphs. I had success trailing a Zebra midge 18 inches below the Prince. Several of the larger fish were snagged. Bob Pharoah caught 4 in two days 16 to 20 inches and I caught all of mine on the first day 22, 21 and two 20's. The next day and a half I was skunked.

The fish are still up there and the scenery will just be getting better with the change in fall colors. If you go, bring plenty of midge patterns. Zebra Midge size 18, in black with gold, black with red rib, grey with gold, grey with white poly gills. Tie some of the midges on longer 200R hooks and keep the abdomens thin.

Denny Rickard's Purple Seal
Buggers size 10 worked in many
areas, including the Upper Owens
and Lake Mary. Various Angora
Leech patterns produced on the
Upper Owens and Crowley. Olive
Punk Perch, Spitz Perch and Grizzly
Hen Perch did produce a few of the
larger rainbows on Crowley but they
were not working as well as last
year due to the lack of weed beds
for the natural perch to hide.





# FLY OF THE MONTH

#### Fireman's Peacock PMX (Parachute Madam X)

Hook: Dry fly, TMC 100 size 10 or 8

Thread: Black 6/0 flat waxed nylon - Danville

Tail: None on this simple version

Abdomen: Peacock herl

Under wing: Pearl Krystal Flash, sparse

Wing: White calf tail


Legs: Black and white striped small or very small centipede leg

**Post:** White poly yarn or Hi-Vis poly

Thorax: Black thread

Hackle: Grizzly saddle or rooster neck

Head: Black thread.



his delicate little fly was given to me by two Salt Lake City Firemen on the Green River. They were catching 25 fish per day on it fished in the seams and along the edges of the back eddies. Note the distinct body shape of an insect like a small stone fly. Peacock abdomen, thin waist, fatter thorax, a thin neck and a distinct head.

Attach thread at the mid hook, wrap to bend. Attach three peacock herl, form a herl rope and wrap to mid shank. Attach 6 strands of pearl flash as under wing. Clean out under-fur and size a sparse calf tail wing. Trim butts and secure in front of flash. Tips should extend one hook gap past the bend. Secure a white poly yarn post at the  $\frac{3}{4}$  to 7/8 point. Wrap a thread around the base of the post 4 or 5 times to make it firmer. Attach a saddle hackle sized for 2 to 2.5 hook gaps, convex

barbs down. Wrap a thread post up the yarn and the base of the quill and back down. Let the hackle stand up while attaching two sets of legs. The rear leg should extend past the wing. Pull the front legs forward and form a distinct thread thorax. Wrap the thread to the back of the post position in preparation for the hackle. Wrap the grizzly hackle counter clockwise while holing up on the poly post. Make 3 or 4 wraps under each other, down the post. Finish close to the body. Wrap three tight turns counter clockwise around the base of the post and hackle tip. Keep it close to the body. Pull the thread forward, form a distinct thread head and whip finish. Trim the hackle tip with the tips of your scissors.

This would be a good fly for an ant, cricket or stonefly on any waters.

# "How To"...SDFF Meeting Set-up and Breakdown 2008

#### SET UP

- ♦ Arrive by 6:30 PM
- ♦ Unlock SDFF cabinets (located on stage left) combination lock #1-2-3
- Carry name-tag cases to back of auditorium. Cases are located adjacent to cabinets.
- Someone is usually there by 6:00 PM to set up condiment table and start coffee
- Move salad bar tables flat against the wall (if they are set up)
- Set up tables next to back windows for name tag boxes
- ♦ Arrange table for raffle ticket sales
- Arrange 2-3 tables in front of stage steps for raffle items
- Set up club P.A. system on stage left.
- Set up slide projector(extension cord in cabinet)and pull down screen in back of stage
- ♦ Make sure faculty restrooms are unlocked and hall lights are on (see custodian)
- Check with custodian about heater for auditorium if needed
- Put out large trash cans and can recycle bin (from teacher's lounge)
- ♦ Set up 10 rows of 10 chairs (5 chairs on each side of aisle)

#### **BREAKDOWN**

- Be sure all chairs and tables are returned to original positions
- Check and clean up trash, spills, and crumbs
- Turn off and put away microphone, screen, and projector
- Return coffee pot, condiment box, blue bin, and name tag boxes to cabinet. LOCK CABINET!
- Custodian is responsible for shutting down and locking up but please double check any windows that may have been opened

It is important that we return this room to the same order as we found it as the school uses this room first thing in the morning and they have no time to rearrange before the kids arrive.




